Save the Date: Evening of Chamber Music to Benefit Lake George Battlefield Park Alliance slated for June 17

The Lake George Battlefield Park Alliance is undergoing a set of projects at its historic property with repairs underway to the site's classic bronze sculptures and preparations for the 2026 reinterment of the remains of 44 soldiers who died at Lake George in 1776. To support these improvements, the Lake George Battlefield Park Alliance will be the beneficiary of a special evening of chamber music presented by the Lake George Music Festival on Tuesday, June 17, beginning at 7 p.m.

The "Lake George Battlefield Park Alliance Night," held at the Carriage House on the grounds of the Fort William Henry Hotel, is part of the Festival's new Community Partnership Program. Thanks to this initiative, 50-percent of all single ticket sales from the evening will directly support the Lake George Battlefield Park Alliance in programs to preserve and promote its national landmark.

Patrons will enjoy an inspiring performance featuring works by Schubert, Florence Price, Rimsky-Korsakov, and a featured composition by guest composer Amy Beth Kirsten.

- Franz Schubert – Shepherd on the Rock
- Florence Price – String Quartet in G Major
- Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov – Quintet for Piano and Winds in B-flat Major
- Amy Beth Kirsten – World Under Glass No. 2
